Children's Services Update



6th & Webster Outreach Services Program:

A partnership for Outreach Services at 1018 Webster Avenue has been formed for the purpose of providing child and family service programs for residents of Fort Frances. The partnership lead agency is the Fort Frances Children's Complex/Best Start Hub services. Members of the partnership group are the Fort Frances Children's Complex, Northwestern Health Unit, Family and Children's Services, Sunset Country Metis, United Native Friendship Centre, Fort Frances Public Library, Fort Frances Museum and the Rainy River DSSAB.

Programming and services that are scheduled to be provided at the site include Best Start Hub children's programming for ages 0 to 6, parenting workshops and seminars, storytime and library access information, Healthy Babies/Healthy Children programs, preventive dental services, sexual health, basic homeskills, quick meal ideas, family support, child development, stress management, employment workshops and an Urban Aboriginal Healthy Living Program that is community based and open to all people. As families begin use of the facility, their input and ideas or requests for specific needs or programming will be taken into consideration for future and ongoing programming.

All partners involved have donated program supplies, equipment, furniture and other needs for provision of services, in addition to their staff involvement for programs. Group collaboration and sharing of resources makes this program a true community based effort making the most of existing local services. Additional funding for the project was awarded by the Moffitt Foundation this year and has been earmarked for the set up and maintenance of the site.

Rainy River Playschool Inc. – Learn, Laugh & Play Children's Centre:

A final site inspection and review of building renovations was completed at 310 Government Road on Friday, June 6/09 with Board Members and the Project Manager for Rainy River Playschool. It is anticipated that the Child Care Centre will be open for business at this new location in August. The Resource Centre has moved into their new space at the site from their former location in June/09. A Grand Opening will be scheduled later on in the year. 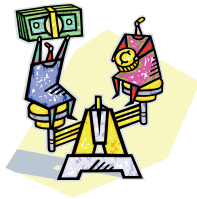

Ontario Works Update



OW will be hosting workshops once a month at the Outreach Services location at 6th and Webster concentrating on Budgeting, Life Skills and Pre-Employment Programs. Stay tuned for times and dates.

If you have a child under age 18, your Ontario Works payment may change as of August 1, 2009. This is because the monthly Ontario Child Benefit payments will increase to help low-income families provide for their children. If you have a child under age 18 and are on the Ontario Works program, you may see the following changes in your Ontario Works payment if you rent or own your home, or live with your parents: If you are a single parent with a child 18 years of age and under, the amount you receive for your family may be lower; and/or If you have a child 13-17 years of age, you will no longer receive an age-related amount for that child.

These changes mean you will receive less from Ontario Works, however, the increase in your monthly Ontario Child Benefit payment will make up the difference. You will continue to receive other help for your children through social assistance (such as shelter allowance and health benefits). You can also claim some or all of your child care costs if you are working. If you are not receiving the Ontario Child Benefit, or are receiving less than the maximum amount of the Ontario Child Benefit, you may be eligible for a Transition Child Benefit through Ontario Works. Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing



The Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing announced on June 16, 2009 that they were assigning allocations to all Service Managers for planning purposes under the Social Housing Renovation and Retrofit Programs. The Rainy River District Social Services Administration Board is pleased to announce that their allocations will be \$585,988 in 2009-10 and \$721,860 in 2010-11. Details on administration agreements and program guidelines will follow in the later part of July.

RRDSSAB Housing Update

The Rainy River District Social Services Administration Board (RRDSSAB) is seeking all low income households in the Rainy River District needing repairs to their principal residence.

Interested homeowners should apply to take advantage of the Northern component of the Canada-Ontario Affordable Housing Program (AHP). Qualifying homeowners will receive funding from RRDSSAB to undertake repairs of modest and affordable ownership housing.

The Northern component of the AHP aims to maintain the affordable housing stock in northern Ontario.
