## **Policy**

The Rainy River District Social Services Administration Board (RRDSSAB) ensures that mandatory Symptom Relief Equipment/Kit checks are completed on a weekly basis and as necessary by Paramedics. This ensures equipment, supplies and medications meet all requirements, in accordance with:

- a) Ontario Regulation 257/00, General, as amended; and
- b) Northwest Region Base Hospital Policies & Procedures, as amended.

## **Procedure**

- 1. Paramedics complete a Symptom Relief Equipment/Kit Check and restocks necessary items:
  - a) each time the Symptom Relief Kit is used or the seal is broken; and
  - b) every Monday morning.
- 2. Paramedics ensure they complete a *Symptom Relief Equipment Checklist* each time they conduct a Symptom Relief Equipment/Kit check.
- 3. The Symptom Relief Equipment/Kit identification number and respective vehicle identification number must be identified on the *Symptom Relief Equipment Checklist*.
- 4. Spare vehicles containing a Symptom Relief Equipment/Kit are to be checked on Monday by the dayshift crew.
- 5. Once completed, the *Symptom Relief Equipment Checklist* is submitted either electronically or in the base lockbox.

- 6. Expiring medications are removed by the Paramedic and replaced, at least one (1) week prior to reaching the expiry date.
- 7. If a Paramedic discovers an expired medication, it is immediately removed, replaced and an operational impact will be completed.
- 8. The Paramedics secure expiring medications in the locked drug cabinet at that base.
- 9. The Deputy Chief, on the next scheduled visit, will remove expiring/expired medications and return them to the Fort Frances Base.
- 10. The Deputy Chief ensures that expired/expiring medications are secured in the Paramedic Clerk's drug cabinet and retained for disposal or training.
- 11. Once sufficient quantities for disposal are reached, the Deputy Chief(s) transports expired medications to the hospital or local pharmacy for disposal.
- 12. All Symptom Relief Equipment/Kits are sealed with a plastic seal after checking and/or restocking.
