## **Policy**

The Rainy River District Social Services Administration Board (RRDSSAB) ensures that when operating Ambulance vehicles, it complies with the processes described in the:

- a) Ambulance Act R.S.O. 1990, Chapter A19, as amended;
- b) Ontario Regulation 257/00, as amended;
- c) Patient Care and Transportation Standards, as amended;
- d) Ontario Ambulance Documentation Standards, as amended; and
- e) Highway Traffic Act, as amended.

## **Procedure**

- 1. In order to ensure that Land Ambulance vehicles are operated in a safe manner, the following are strictly adhered to:
  - every Paramedic employed by the RRDSSAB must comply with the direction and instruction issued by the Central Ambulance Communications Centre (CACC) with respect to the assignment of calls;
  - b) every movement of the Ambulance or Emergency Response Vehicle is reported to the Communication Officer;
  - c) any vehicle removed from or re-entering services is reported to the Communication Officer;
  - vehicles cannot be used for purposes other than the provision of Land Ambulance services, unless approved by the Chief of Paramedic Services (PS);

- e) Ambulances which are not in service are driven only if a sign bearing the phrase "not in service" is displayed at the front and back of the vehicle;
- f) vehicle numbers must be clearly displayed in the lower left corner of the windshield and the left side of the rear of the vehicle;
- g) all vehicles are marked with the "Rainy River District Social Services Administration Board" logo;
- h) all Paramedics and Emergency Medical Attendants responding to calls must meet the qualifications of employment established by the *Ambulance Act*, and operate the Ambulance vehicles in accordance with the *Highway Traffic Act*, as it relates to the care & operation of an Ambulance and Emergency Response Vehicle;
- all Paramedics and Emergency Medical Attendants must hold a valid driver's license authorizing them to operate an Ambulance vehicle;
- j) all Paramedics and Emergency Medical Attendants must have in their possession their Ministry of Health & Long-Term Care (MoHLTC) issued *Identification Card (ID Card)*, *Driver's License* and appropriate travel documents at all times while on duty;
- k) no Paramedics and Emergency Medical Attendants will report for duty, nor while on duty, consume, take or have in his/her possession, any liquor or drug which may impair his/her ability to function in the capacity of his/her employment;
- no Paramedics and Emergency Medical Attendants will smoke any tobacco or any other substance, while in an Ambulance or Emergency Response Vehicle;
- m) the main VHF radio and satellite radio must remain on while the Ambulance or Emergency Response Vehicle is in operation;
- n) all Paramedics and Emergency Medical Attendants must make every effort to ensure that all passengers and patients are secure by means of a seat belt, or stretcher- or incubator-belting system, and that any stretcher and/or incubator is firmly secured in the vehicle:
- o) all Paramedics and Emergency Medical Attendants must make every effort, prior to transport, to ensure that all equipment is

- secured within designated compartments, or secured by means of seat belts, or securing straps to protect passengers and patients.
- p) all Paramedics adhere to the safety of patients being transported in Ambulance vehicles, and for the safety of citizens sharing the roadways, per *Policy LA-6.6: Excessive Speed/Emergency Warning Systems*;
- q) collision reporting is completed, in accordance with the *Ontario Ambulance Documentation Standards* and *RRDSSAB Policy LA-1.14: Vehicle Accident*, and forwarded to the Chief of PS within twenty-four (24) hours of the occurrence;
- While reversing a vehicle, a back-up guide must be utilized at all times excepting where a drive through access is provided for a garage;
- s) A back-up guide will be wearing a high visibility vest or coat during backing operations;
- t) While reversing the driver will ensure that their window is lowered to permit effective communication with the back-up guide; and
- u) If a back-up guide is not available the driver will use any available means possible to safely position the vehicle, i.e. exiting the vehicle to ascertain the area, backup cameras, backup alarms.
